

MINUTES

CITY OF LOGANVILLE
Regular Council Meeting
Thursday, July 11, 2013 7:30pm
Council Chambers

The City Council for the City of Loganville met on Thursday, July 11, 2013 at 7:30 at City Hall for their regularly scheduled Council Meeting. Acting Mayor Mark Kiddoo and Council Members Skip Baliles, Mike Jones, Michelle Lynch and Rey Martinez (via phone due to military service.) Mayor Elect Dan Curry and Council Elect Jay Boland were also present.

Acting Mayor Mark Kiddoo called the meeting to order at 7:35pm.

Rev. Jody Hice gave the invocation and the pledge to the flag was led.

Council Member Michelle Lynch asked that an amendment to the zoning ordinance under Planning & Development be added to the agenda. Council Member Michelle Lynch then made a motion to adopt the agenda with the noted addition. Council Member Skip Baliles seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0.

Council Member Mike Jones made a motion to approve the minutes from last month's meeting. Council Member Rey Martinez seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0.

Council Member Michelle Lynch made a motion to approve last month's financial report as presented. Council Member Rey Martinez seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0.

Judge Brad Brownlow swore in newly elected Council Member Jay Boland and Mayor Dan Curry. Both took a moment to recognize their families and friends and took their respective seats with the rest of the Council.

Mayor Dan Curry presented Vice Mayor Mark Kiddoo with a commemorative gavel and thanked him for his service during the last few months.

Mayor Dan Curry presented Mark Myers with a proclamation in support of his effort to raise money for breast cancer research through his Contract to Cure Cancer and the purchase of the Breast Cancer Awareness Stamps. Mayor Curry challenged the other Mayors in Walton and Gwinnett County to purchase 200 stamps in support of this effort.

Council Member Michelle Lynch made a motion to deny Case #A13-005, Town & Country Pet Salon located at 4826 Highway 81 North to annex 1.083 acres. Council Member Rey Martinez seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

Mayor Curry noted for the record that since the annexation case was denied no action was necessary to be taken on Case #R13-006 and #V13-007.

Council Member Michelle Lynch made a motion to approve the moratorium for RM-4, RM-6 and RM-8 for 90 days. Mrs. Lynch explained that this moratorium would not effect or change any current zoning. Council Member Mark Kiddoo seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

Council Member Michelle Lynch made a motion to approve Zoning Changes to Section 119. Council Member Mark Kiddoo seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

Council Member Michelle Lynch made a motion approve the purchase of a 2013 Ford F-150 for the Planning & Development Department for \$16,127.62. Council Member Skip Baliles seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

Council Member Michelle Lynch thanked everyone for their help with the July 4th Parade and Celebration. She thanked Great Western Meats for their donation of hot dogs, Ingles for donating hot dog buns, Chick-fil-a for donating the condiments and Legacy Lions Club for their help with the event as well. She also announced that beginning in August the City would be hosting concerts at the Town Green through the Autumn Heritage Festival.

Council Member Skip Baliles made a motion to allow City Manager Bill Jones the authorization to approve invoices up to \$9,000 until the project is complete for the replacement of water meter registers. Council Member Mike Jones seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

Council Member Skip Baliles made a motion to approve the Annual State Drinking Water Contract for \$12,140. Council Member Mark Kiddoo seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

City Manager Bill Jones presented bid / plans for the renovation of the well house. He explained that once completed it would match the new pavilion. Council Member Michelle Lynch made a motion to approve the project not to exceed \$20,000. Council Member Mark Kiddoo seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

City Manager Bill Jones also reported that negotiations are continuing for the 2013 Gwinnett County SPLOST and a Called Meeting will be necessary before August 6 to approve the final IGA. Mr. Jones stated that this SPLOST is projected to bring in \$1.3 million to the City of Loganville to be used for Transportation and Infrastructure purposes.

City Attorney Karen Woodward reported on the status of the Alcohol Appeals regarding the package stores. She explained that Judge Wynn is handling both

Walton County Appeals and we are still waiting on Gwinnett County regarding the hearing for the Gwinnett Case.

City Attorney Karen Woodward presented the Council with a check from a Class Action Law Suit for \$17.80 that the City participated in.

Mayor Dan Curry presented the Council with revised Committee Assignments.

With no further business, Council Member Michelle Lynch made a motion to adjourn. Council Member Rey Martinez seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

Meeting adjourned at 8:34pm.
